August 2017

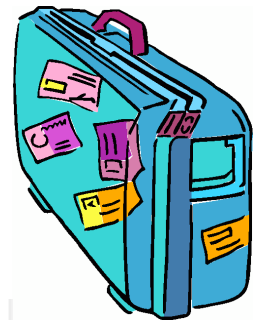
Wow, that sounds great - a Third Grader!!!
